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



What's so unique about life in Hull is the eclectic choice of living. You can live in a stylish city centre apartment, a classic Georgian townhouse or a country cottage. Best of all, house prices in Hull are significantly less than the national average. In fact, nearby Beverley, a historic market town, was recently voted the best place to live in the UK. What's more, The Royal Bank of Scotland has it at the top of its affordable affluent index.

Think beyond leading-edge

Education

Hull and East Riding boasts a number of high quality Schools and Education providers. All with a focus on the future, enterprise and, of course, keeping your children happy.

As the University is a stone's throw away from East Yorkshire, you'll be within a short distance of the area's finest schools. East Yorkshire schools are regularly above national average in Key Stage 2, GCSE and A-level performance tables. In fact, last year, A-level pass rates were at a record 97%.

But formal education begins with primary schools. In recent years, many primary schools in the area have been refurbished and new ones have opened. The improved accessibility and sustainability of schools has lifted spirits and boosted morale. And it shows in the results. Last year, 85% of children achieved the level 4 benchmark in English and 81% did so in Mathematics – statistics that considerably exceed the national average.

At GCSE level, the number of pupils gaining five or more grades at A* - C continues to rise above the national average – recently achieving an all time high.

The increase in the number of pupils achieving excellent GCSE results has led to aspirations and confidence, with more and more young people going on to further education or vocational training.

Much of the recent success in local education has been down to an added emphasis on building relationships between schools, colleges, businesses and the community.



Location

Hull's position at the gateway to Europe makes it an important centre for national and international travel.

The city has excellent transport connections and a unique combination of air, sea, road and rail links. York and Leeds are an hour away by train, and you can visit Manchester in less than two hours.

Humberside International Airport is just a 30 minute drive from the centre, and you can be in London in just two and a half hours with the regular direct train service.
